Both Frank and Ceil are members of the Rotary Club of East Hartford, Connecticut.

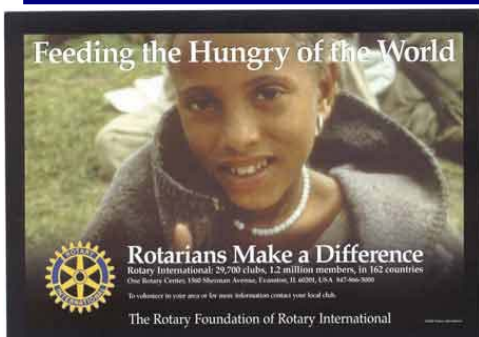

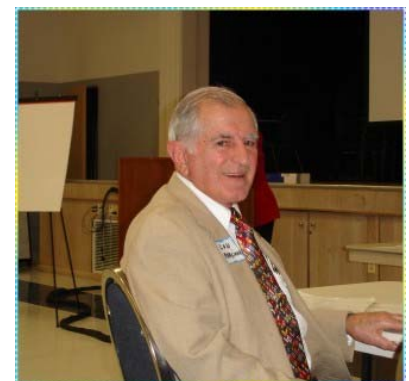
